# Exploring your care options

## Supporting you at home

Leeds City Council Adult Social Care will try and do all they can to support you to live independently in your own home with dignity for as long as possible. If you are finding it difficult to remain living at home, there are many services available to help. Adult Social Care may be able to provide support for you at home and there are special equipment, pendant alarms and a continence service. There may be adaptations that could be done to your house. Adult Social Care could arrange a break or regular breaks for you.

You don't have to accept how they organise things you can now choose to have the money to

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arrange your services yourself. With Direct Payments you can get the money that Adult Social Care would have spent on your services to buy and organise services you want.

For all of these services you do need to have an assessment first to see how your needs could be best met and what services you could be eligible for. (See page 8.)

If however you are sure that you cannot cope in your own home and need to consider going into a residential home then Adult Social Care hope you will find the information in this directory useful.

## Moving into a care home

Thinking about giving up your own home and moving into a care home permanently is a big step to take and you should be sure it is the right decision for you. If you do decide that is what you want, then you need to be clear about your rights, what you will have to pay and what services you will receive for your money. Adult Social Care hopes this directory will help you find the information you will need.

### Take your time

It's difficult to make such an important decision in a hurry or without proper information, or at a time of crisis – for example, just after discharge from hospital, after an illness, or just after the death of a partner, close relative or carer. Moving into a care home may seem the easiest answer at the time but with careful planning, you may be able to stay in your own home. (See page 26.)

### Different types of care homes

Care homes are no longer categorised as 'Residential' or 'Nursing' homes. All homes are now registered as 'care homes' under the Care Standards Act 2000. However, they can register to provide different types of care, including nursing. Some homes cater specifically for people of particular cultures or religions. Care homes are run by voluntary groups, private individuals and organisations, trusts, or by Leeds City Council Adult Social Care.

### Regulations and guidelines

All homes have to be registered with the Care Quality Commission (CQC). The CQC registers and inspects care homes, including homes run by the Council. It looks very carefully at all aspects of the home such as care practices, the building, the suitability of the people running the home, facilities and staffing. Each care home must register with the CQC and only provide the type of care for which they are registered. All care homes are inspected in accordance with CQC inspection procedures and you have the right to see the home's most recent inspection report. The report will be available at the home or from the CQC website: [www.cqc.org.uk](http://www.cqc.org.uk). All homes are star rated by The Care Standards Act 2000 and National Minimum Standards are regulations and guidelines, setting standards for all types of care homes. **CQC CONTACT DETAILS ARE ON PAGE 24.** ►

### • *Care homes registered to provide personal care only*

Care homes, whether run by the council (see below), private or voluntary organisations, are for people who can no longer manage to live independently. The GP and district nurse would continue to provide health care for residents, in the same way as if they were in their own home.

### • *Care homes that are registered to provide nursing care as well as personal care*

These types of care homes provide 24 hour nursing care by qualified nurses and care assistants. The person in charge of the home must be a qualified nurse or doctor and there will always be nursing staff on duty. Some of these homes are run by voluntary organisations, trusts or charities, but most are run by individuals or companies.

### • *Care homes run by the Council*

Leeds City Council provides residential care for older people in homes across the city and Adult Social Care is responsible for managing these. All council care homes are registered to provide personal care and have to meet the same standards as private and voluntary homes. Most homes offer short stays (respite) as well as permanent care.

There are a smaller number of homes that provide specialist care for people with dementia, including short stays to give carers a break. You can find out more about council care homes from Adult Social Care, see page 24 for contact details.

### Specialist care homes

Some homes provide care especially for people who are physically disabled, have learning difficulties, mental health problems, dementia or a terminal illness.

Specialist homes are run by voluntary groups, charities, trusts, private individuals, companies or by Leeds City Council. Specialist care places are provided by general care homes as well as care homes registered to provide nursing care.

### Respite care

Respite care means giving a break to someone who is usually looked after in their own home and their carer. It may be a short stay (usually one or two weeks) in a care home or somewhere else, for example, using the Family Placement Scheme.

### Recommendations and care homes listings

The information about each care home has been given by the homes themselves and Leeds City Council cannot take responsibility for the accuracy of the information or mistakes. The council cannot recommend any particular home. The Care Quality Commission (CQC) supplied the care homes listings for this year. The CQC is responsible for the registration and inspection of all care services.

All care homes listings are kept up to date and you can contact the CQC for the very latest information. Please see page 24 for contact details.

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# Organising a care home place

## Getting Adult Social Care involved

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If you can find your own place and are not applying for help with care costs, you do not need to involve Adult Social Care; you can seek a place in any home that is able to provide the right level of care for you and meet your care needs but Adult Social Care can offer advice if you'd like them to. Care charges are considerable and if you think that your money might run out it is a good idea to talk about it at the beginning.

When choosing a home you will need to consider carefully whether you have enough money to pay for your care home fees, not just for now but well

into the future.

If you want to apply for help towards the cost, you will need to be assessed by Adult Social Care. Your local Adult Social Care office will arrange this with you.

You will also be asked to fill in a financial assessment form and there will be an assessment meeting.

If you have had an assessment and it is decided that you are not eligible to get help paying your care costs, Adult Social Care can still give you help and guidance during the process of setting up your care.

## Where do I start?

### Entitlement to services

Most organisations have guidelines to help them decide whether a person in their particular circumstances will receive support or not. Adult Social Care has to use the same Fair Access to Care eligibility criteria. This is to make sure that money is spent fairly. Eligibility criteria are the conditions you have to meet to get help from us.

Please contact Adult Social Care on 0113 247 8630 if you would like information about Fair Access to Care. Adult Social Care will need to do an assessment to determine what level of support you are entitled to.

### What is an assessment?

It is a meeting that involves a detailed look at your circumstances, what your needs are, who is presently helping with your care and which other people or services may be able to help. It may be that you are already receiving some services (such as home care, day care, district nurse) and if you agree, Adult Social Care will also consult the people providing these services.

If you have a carer – a relative or friend who is taking some responsibility for caring for you – their opinion and own needs will also be taken into account. Adult Social Care will listen to your views and your opinions will be most important.

The assessment will decide, with you, whether or not you need permanent care and if so, whether that should be in a general care home or one registered to provide nursing care. If you would like an assessment please contact Adult Social Care, see page 24 for details.

## The right to choose

If you are paying for yourself, you have a right to choose which home you would like to move into. If Adult Social Care is paying towards the cost, you still have a right to choose your home, provided:

- the home is suitable for your needs,
- the cost of the home is not more than the Local Authority would usually expect to pay for someone with your needs,
- accommodation is available at the home, and
- the owners at the home are prepared to provide your accommodation under a contract with the council.

If you would like to live in a home that charges

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more than Adult Social Care would usually pay, you can still choose to live there but someone else (for example a relative or good friend) has to pay this extra or 'top up' for you. This person is referred to as a 'third party' and they would need to enter into a legal agreement about the arrangement. You cannot pay this top up yourself.

You may try to find a home in the area you live at the moment. You could look for a home outside of Leeds. You may know people already in a home and wish to go there, although this could mean that you have to wait for a vacancy.

## What happens after you move into a care home?

If Adult Social Care has been involved, they will want to make sure that you are satisfied with the home and after about six weeks they will check to see that things are going well. Your social worker will talk to you and your family and there may be a

meeting of all those involved.

If you're not happy with the home or any other arrangements regarding your care, you should say so and help will be offered to sort out any problems.

## Care home contracts

An Office of Fair Trading (OFT) market study on care homes for older people found that a number of care home contracts for self-funding residents are unfair or unclear.

The main areas of the study focused on:

- The lack of price transparency (the cost of care, what services the price includes, how often the price is reviewed).
- The need for better complaints procedures.
- Complex or unfair terms that make it difficult to assess the true rights and obligations of the

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resident and of the care home under the contract.

- The procedure for termination of a contract.
- The administering of medication.

The report applies only to those paying for their own care and can be obtained from the OFT (reference OFT 780). [www.of.gov.uk](http://www.of.gov.uk). It is advisable to consult a solicitor before signing any contract to ensure that the terms are fair and you understand your rights and obligations.

# Finance

Everyone's financial situation is different. The social worker is there to help you and discuss your circumstances and the choices that are available to you. You don't have to accept any of the choices you are offered.

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## Who can get financial help from the Council to pay for care?

Everyone has the right to an assessment of their care needs. If you are assessed by a social worker as needing care you may be entitled to receive financial help. The amount you will be asked to pay is related to how much you are able to pay.

Your contribution to the fees will be calculated according to your income and capital. This includes your retirement pension and works pension if you have one. Capital includes money you may have in savings, shares and bonds etc, and the value of your assets, such as property. Your contribution will be reviewed annually to take account of any changes to your financial situation. You can request a review more often than this if there is a change in your financial circumstances.

If you have less than £23,000 in savings and

investments you are likely to be entitled to financial help. The amount of financial help you get depends on your income and exactly how much capital you have, and the amount you pay will reduce as your capital reduces.

If you have more than £23,000 you will generally be expected to pay all the costs yourself. However, it is still a good idea to talk to a social worker, particularly if you only have slightly more than this amount. Care charges are considerable and if you think that your money might run out it is a good idea to talk about it at the beginning.

If your capital is less than £14,000, and the home you choose charges fees that are within your local authority's funding rate, your contribution will be assessed only on your income.

### Do I have to tell Adult Social Care how much money I've got?

If the council agrees that you need residential care, or you ask for financial help they will need to ask you for some detailed information including some history of your financial position. Based on the information you give them they will be able to tell you how much you will have to pay towards your care.

If you decide you don't want to tell the council this information, they can't complete a financial assessment and you would have to pay the full cost of your care.

If the council or benefits agency decides that you have previously given capital or assets away in order to reduce your financial contribution, they have the power to treat you as still having that capital. They will take it into account when they assess how much you have to pay.

## About your house

### Will I have to sell my house?

The value of your property is usually included in your assessment and most people choose to sell their property to release the capital. In most circumstances the property will be taken into consideration as an asset.

There are circumstances where the council does not take the value of your property into account, if, for example, it's occupied by your partner, a relative who is aged over 60 years or incapacitated, who has lived in it for sometime or a child under 16 years who you maintain or a separated partner who is a lone parent.

If you do not want to sell your property, you can ask for a Deferred Charge. This means that a charge will be put on your property so the debt against it can be built up and paid later. Your contribution would include the value of the property, although your ongoing weekly payment would be based on income and 'available capital' (e.g. savings) only.

In Leeds, if you have a property that is worth more than £23,000 and have savings etc of more than £3,000, you are expected to pay all the costs yourself until your capital reduces to £3,000.

There are various funding options available to a person with property. Each case is looked at individually so please discuss this with your care manager.

After this discussion, you are strongly advised to take independent advice about the best option for you. The council cannot recommend where you go for this advice, but as a starting off point, you may want to approach an organisation such as Age Concern or Help the Aged. You are advised to not give up your home until you are sure that you are happy and settled in your care home.

### Will Adult Social Care pay my fees while I am selling the property?

When someone with a property enters care, the value of the property is disregarded for up to 12 weeks. The 12 weeks start from the date you became eligible for funding from the Local Authority. After that, if your property has not sold Adult Social Care can lend you the money to pay for your care charged against the value of your property.

You will still have to pay a weekly contribution to the home yourself based on your income and available capital as mentioned above. When you have sold your property you will have to make repayments to Adult Social Care for the loaned amount, and then if you are left with more than £23,000 capital after the loan is repaid, you will have to meet the full cost of your care home yourself.

### What if I have given or want to give my house away?

If you give your house away (for example to a relative) then the council has the power to treat you as if you still own it and the value may still be included in the assessment of your contribution. If it is worth more than £23,000 you would have to pay the full costs yourself. This would depend on when you gave it away and your circumstances at that time.

### Council tax

If you move into a care home and your property is left empty then you shouldn't have to pay council tax.

## Other questions

### How do I find out how much I will have to pay?

Ask your social worker to find this out for you. Once your financial details have been recorded, an assessment of what you will pay can be worked out for you.

### How much of my pension would I be able to keep?

You can keep a personal allowance, which is for you to spend on whatever you like. It should not be used to pay for services agreed in the price; it's for things like newspapers, sweets, hairdressing and so on. At April 2009 the personal allowance was £21.90 and is reviewed annually. People who get Savings Credit are entitled to an extra amount of up to £5.65 maximum, depending on how much Savings Credit they get.

### Is there any financial help I can claim that is not means tested?

If you are self funding, Attendance Allowance is a

non-means tested, non-taxable allowance paid at the lower rate of £47.10 for those needing care by day and, at a higher rate of £70.35 for those needing care both by day and night. Also, whether your stay is temporary or permanent, if you receive nursing care in a care home you may be entitled to an NHS Nursing Care Contribution towards registered nurse time costs. This is £106.30 per week and applies to England only. Wales, Northern Ireland and Scotland pay different amounts.

If Health and Social Care professionals decide you qualify for Continuing NHS health care (see page 15 entitled Continuing Care) then nursing care provided to you is free of charge, wherever it is delivered.

### What if I don't understand or don't want to be bothered with financial matters?

You may wish to arrange for someone else to deal with your pensions and benefits. This person is called an appointee and they act upon your instructions.

It's also possible to appoint someone to have responsibility for dealing with your wider financial affairs, by giving them power of attorney.

## Care home charges

### Private and voluntary homes

These homes charge according to the services and facilities they provide and their location, so the full cost of a place will vary from home to home.

See page 32 where all care home listings in Leeds start.

### Council homes

There are 22 council care homes in Leeds.

Homes run by Adult Social Care have a maximum charge, which is based on the actual cost of living in the home. It is the most that anyone can be charged for a place. From April 2009 the charge is £510.30 per week.

The rate you would pay is based on an assessment of your income and capital assets, less your personal allowance of at least £21.90 per week.

### Standard charges

The council has agreed rates with a significant number of the private and voluntary care home owners in Leeds. These charges are the maximum amount that the homes will normally charge Adult Social Care for a place. Homes may sometimes have agreed a third party top up with the Local Authority. This needs to be paid by a person other than the resident although there are circumstances when a resident could be his/her own third party. There is a leaflet called, "Guidance on third party top ups for residents and nursing homes" (CFP9.5) available from Adult Social Care. Your care manager should give you a copy of this. The amount the council pays can vary in some circumstances.

The amount that the council would expect to pay varies considerably depending on the needs of the person. Funding arrangements can be extremely complex and you are advised to check with your social worker what the position would be for you.

# Alternatives to a care home place

## Getting support to help you to continue to live at home

There are many different services available in Leeds that may be able to help you to continue to live in your own home. If you want to find out about the full range of services available to older people in Leeds, the "A-Z Health and Social Care Information in Leeds" is available at your local One Stop Centre, some libraries and health centres and from Adult Social Care at Merrion House, telephone 0113 247 8630.

### Information

You can also find information about how to stay independent and keep well on the Infostore website [www.olderpeopleleeds.info](http://www.olderpeopleleeds.info) - the comprehensive information website for older people in Leeds. The site includes details of hundreds of services and organisations. You can also read and print off a wide range of documents, including leaflets and guides.

The Infostore can be used by people with a range of visual and/ or motor impairments. The site has been produced by Leeds City Council in partnership with Leeds Older People's Forum and Leeds Primary Care Trust. See page 3 for more information.

### Adaptations for your home

If you are disabled and need adaptations to your home then you will need an assessment by an occupational therapist from Adult Social Care. Small items such as grab rails can be provided free of charge. It may be possible to fund larger items such as stairlifts through Disabled Facilities Grants depending on your financial situation. For more information call Customer Services on 0113 222 4401 or minicom 0113 222 4410.

### Equipment for daily living

Equipment can be provided to help with personal and domestic tasks around the home. It can be provided free of charge on long term loan following an assessment by an occupational therapist from Adult Social Care. Call Customer Services on 0113 222 4401 or minicom 0113 222 4410.

### Alarm systems (including pendant alarms)

These can provide an emergency contact service and pendant alarm for older or disabled people. The service is operated 24 hours a day, seven days a week

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and is available to people who live alone, are unable to deal with an emergency, or have difficulty moving about. There is a connection fee and charge. For more information call Care Ring on 0113 224 3485.

### Care and Repair

Care and Repair provides a wide range of services to help older and disabled people to live independently. Services include home maintenance and minor repairs. Tel: 0113 240 6009.

### Home care

Home care provides a service for people who have been assessed as needing personal care as a primary need within their package of care. Charges are made according to how much income and savings people have. Some of this work is provided by private and voluntary organisations. Adult Social Care home care is now known as the Community Support Service. Call Customer Services on 0113 222 4401 or minicom 0113 222 4410. (See page 4.)

### Domestic services

You may be able to get help with shopping, cleaning and gardening through the Keeping House Scheme. There is a charge for these services. Telephone Customer Services on 0113 222 4401 or minicom 0113 222 4410 or visit [www.keepinghouse.co.uk](http://www.keepinghouse.co.uk).

### Getting a break – Family Placement

The Family Placement Scheme (at Leeds Adult Social Care) is a citywide service that provides breaks for carers, children and adults with physical or learning disabilities, older people and people with dementia. For further information telephone 0113 247 8659.

### Health visitors and district nurses

These people can visit you in your home and can give you support and advice about any health problems.

# How a personal budget can give you more choice and control over the support you need with daily living

People who are eligible for support from Leeds Adult Social Care can ask for a direct payment or – from early 2010 – a personal budget. This is money from the council that you can use to choose and manage your own support. You can, for example, employ a worker called a personal assistant. This means *you* decide who provides the care you need, and when and how they provide it. With a personal budget, you'll be able to choose from both council and non-council services, whereas direct payments can only be used to pay for support from non-council providers. A lot more information will be available about personal budgets over the coming months. ## Getting support to help you to continue to live at home continued

District nurses provide skilled nursing treatment, care and support to patients and their carers in their homes. Contact them through your GP or local health centre.

### Continence care

Leeds Continence Service provides confidential advice and support on all aspects of continence care and management. For details telephone 0113 305 5138. You can also speak to your GP.

### Continuing Care

Continuing Care is the name given to the care needed by an adult who requires help to manage their daily life because of an illness, disability, accident or the effects of getting older. Continuing care broken down into two kinds:

- Continuing NHS health care is provided solely by the NHS if you have extensive healthcare needs. This is free of charge, wherever it is delivered.
- Continuing NHS health and social care is a package of care that involves services and funding from both the NHS and Adult Social Care.

The national policy on charging means health care must be provided free of charge but you may have to make a reasonable financial contribution towards your social care. You can ask for an assessment by health and social care professionals if you think you may be eligible for either continuing NHS health care or continuing NHS health and social care.

They will visit you to identify and prioritise your needs and the assessment will be used to decide what services must be provided, where and who pays for them.

If your needs change, regular reviews will be carried out and your care and/or funding arrangements will change after to meet them. You can pick up a leaflet about Continuing Care from your local Adult Social Care office, medical centre or hospital.

### Sheltered housing and extra care

#### • Sheltered housing

This is normally a group of flats or bungalows with a warden. Extra care sheltered housing offers a higher degree of support and may be an alternative to going into a care home.

#### • Intermediate care

This offers short term care with medical support to help prevent older people being unnecessarily admitted to hospital and to help when people are discharged from hospital.

### Older people's Neighbourhood Network Schemes

In most parts of Leeds there are now local voluntary schemes that can provide social contact, services and information to older people. There are leaflets available listing the schemes in different parts of Leeds. Telephone 0113 247 8630 to get a copy of the leaflet that covers your area.

# Essential information

## Safeguarding adults

If you have concerns that someone is not being treated well or is possibly being abused in any way, financially, emotionally or physically then you can make a referral by telephoning Customer Services on 0113 222 4401 and stating that you wish to make a Safeguarding Adults Referral.

If you believe the person is in imminent danger or in need of immediate medical attention, dial 999 and ask for the police or ambulance as appropriate.

If you think a crime has been committed, but the person is not in imminent danger, contact the Police Call Centre on 0845 6060 606.

If it is outside of normal office hours and there is no imminent danger to the individual, you can make a referral by contacting the Emergency Duty Service on 0113 240 9536 and tell them you wish to make a Safeguarding Adults Referral.

**If you are not sure whether to make a referral you can contact the Leeds Safeguarding Adults Partnership Support Unit for advice on 0113 224 3511.**



## Complaints

It is hoped that things will go well and usually they do, but if you are not happy there are several ways to make a complaint about a care home:

- If at all possible try to resolve the complaint with the home. The staff may be able to put things right straight away.
- If this does not resolve the complaint or you don't wish to raise it with the home, you could contact:
- The Care Quality Commission (CQC): see page 24 for contact details.
- The Complaints Manager at Social Care. If your

place is funded through Adult Social Care you can make a formal complaint to the Complaints Manager. The 'Complaints' form is available from:

## Out of Leeds providers

Are you aware that you can choose a care home outside the Leeds area? You may want to be closer to friends, family members or you may want to relocate to a favourite town or seaside resort.

If you're state-funded, Leeds City Council is still responsible for your care fees, even if you choose a care home in another region. The home you choose must be suitable for your assessed needs, comply with the terms and conditions set by the council

and agree a fee with the council. The fees that you will pay may vary. Leeds City Council will normally offer the home the fees that the host council would pay in your chosen region.

You must seek further advice before making your decision. If you're self-funded obviously you have freedom of choice.

## How solicitors can help

Our care and legal system is complex, and the implementation of the Mental Capacity Act 2005 means we are in a time of immense change in the law, making expert advice vital. The Act legalises current best practice and common law principles concerning people who may lack mental capacity and those who take decisions on their behalf.

A solicitor can give you impartial advice about wills, making gifts, estate planning and Powers of Attorney. Some can also offer guidance on immediate and long-term care plans.

Lasting Powers of Attorney (LPA) allow you to appoint someone you trust to make decisions about your personal welfare, including healthcare and consent to medical treatment, and/ or your property and financial affairs. An LPA is only valid once registered with the Office of the Public Guardian. It allows for a person of your choice to make decisions on your behalf at a time when you may be unable.

The Court of Protection can issue Orders directing the management of a person's property and financial affairs if they are incapable of managing their own affairs should they not have a LPA. Preparing an LPA is always advisable, providing you have somebody sufficiently trustworthy to appoint as your attorney.

An 'advance directive' allows you to communicate your wishes in respect of future medical treatment but it is not legally binding.

You may instead wish to make a living will, properly known as an 'advance decision' setting out treatment that you do not want to receive in specified circumstances, which would legally have to be followed, even if you die as a result.

Any proposed Gift out of your estate needs careful consideration of the benefits, risks and implications, particularly on any future liability for care costs or tax liability

Long-term care: whether you remain in your own home or move into sheltered or residential care, you may qualify for financial assistance in the form of social care and NHS-funded care and welfare benefits.

Contact several firms, explain your situation and ask for an estimate of cost and an idea of time scales involved.

# Inspection of care services

The Care Quality Commission (CQC) regulates, inspects and reviews all adult social care services in the public, private and voluntary sectors, including care homes and home care providers.

Following an inspection, each service is given a report of how they rate against standards set down in law as well as a star rating, similar to those used by other organisations such as hotels. These ratings provide an 'at-a-glance' idea of how a service is performing and are useful when considering potential care homes or home care providers.

The ratings range from 'no stars' representing a 'poor' service to '1 star' an 'adequate' service, '2 stars' denote 'good' and '3 stars'-'excellent'.

## What is assessed?

The CQC looks at seven categories or 'outcome groups' concerning the National Minimum Care Standards in care homes. These are: choice of home; health and personal care; daily life and social activities; complaints and protection; environment; staffing and management and administration. Obviously, the more areas that are graded 'excellent', the more likely a service is to be graded '3 stars'.

## How are the ratings decided?

These are based on a key inspection by the CQC. This will include a review of all facilities and systems of control, interviews with residents, their families and staff, surveys completed by residents and families and information provided by the home in its Annual Quality Assurance Assessment (AQAA) and the Inspector's own observations.

## What makes an 'excellent' care service?

An 'excellent' rating is awarded if at least half the outcome groups are rated 'good' or 'excellent'; all the safety and management areas are considered 'good' and at least one is 'excellent' and no outcome group is rated 'poor'. A sustained track record of good performance and managing improvement is also taken into account.

## Are all care services rated?

The CQC visits the majority of services once a year and all those inspected so far will have a rating.

Those still awaiting inspection are marked 'not yet rated'. This means nothing detrimental to the service and is merely a question of timescale.

## What if a care service has a 'no star' rating?

If this happens the service will have to complete an improvement plan. This will include: what action is going to be taken to improve services and to ensure that those actions are successful; the date the actions will be completed; the name of the person responsible for each action and the person in charge of the overall co-ordination of the plan. The service will also receive another inspection within six months.

If the CQC has serious concerns about a service it can close it down.

Some care services are newly registered and will not receive their first inspection and quality rating until six months after their registration.

## Inspection frequency

Services will no longer receive an inspection each year. Services judged as 'poor' will receive at least two inspections a year, so they will be able to quickly improve their rating.

Meanwhile services rated 'excellent' can expect a visit from the Inspector only once every two-three years.

Usually all care services without any inspection reports on the website are newly registered.

- Is the home easy to get to for relatives and friends?
- Does the home provide its own transport?

## ACCOMMODATION

- Are bedrooms single or shared? Is there a choice?
- Can you decorate and re-arrange your room to suit yourself?
- Can you bring your own furniture and TV?
- Is there a call system for emergencies?
- Are there enough sockets in your room?
- Can you control the heating in your room?
- Can you lock your room and is there a secure place for valuables?
- Is there a separate dining room? Bar?
- Are there toilet facilities within easy reach of the communal rooms?
- Are there both showers and baths?
- Are bathrooms adapted to help people in and out of the bath?

- Can you have snacks or drinks any time?
- Can you eat in your room?

## ACTIVITIES

- Can you continue to pursue your hobbies and interests?
- What sorts of activities and entertainment are organised?
- Do they cater for all cultures?
- Are outings and holidays arranged? How much do they cost?
- Are escorts available if necessary?
- Is a library service available?
- Can you have your own flower bed or help in the garden?
- Can you stay in your own room if you want to?

## GARDENS

- Are the grounds/gardens attractive?
- Are all areas safe and accessible?
- Is there somewhere to sit?

## CONTRACT TERMS

- Can you retain your own room if away?
- Can you have a short-stay or trial period?
- Will you be given a statement of terms on admission?
- Are all procedures, such as complaints, clearly spelt-out?

# Independent home care providers

In order to enable people to live in their own home for as long as possible a range of home care services are available from independent home care providers. A range of help is on offer from day-to-day tasks such as cleaning, shopping and food preparation/cooking through to personal care that helps with tasks like dressing, bathing, toileting and prompting the taking of medication. Carers need to be properly trained particularly in moving and handling and the use of hoists for some tasks.

## Daily care / domestic support

Paid care workers can call in on a daily basis to assist with any of the tasks described above. Depending on the level of help required their visits can be just half an hour or up to several hours. Generally, visits are available from 7am until 10pm. Some people will need multiple visits per day. Night services can also be provided. The hourly rate for these types of services typically range from £9 to £15 per hour depending on the services required, the time of day and the location. Rural areas may present particular difficulties and a travel charge will probably be made in addition to the normal hourly rate.

## Live-in care

24 hour live-in care can accommodate people with a very high dependency on a permanent basis. It can also provide respite breaks for regular carers and short-term support following hospital discharge.

In some cases it's preferable and more economic to have a carer actually living in the home. This can be for a short period eg a week, or on an ongoing basis.

Typical charges for this service range from £520 to £650 per week depending on the amount of care and the particular skills required. Live-in care is also available to people with permanent physical or mental disabilities who require long-term ongoing care.

All home care providers are regulated and inspected by the Care Quality Commission who publish inspection reports on their website [www.cqc.org.uk](http://www.cqc.org.uk). When considering a service it's always a good idea to check their report.

Before you make any decisions regarding the provision of care, be sure to contact several providers and ask for a 'Service User's Guide' and their charges and a draft contract between you and the care provider.
